


Two fonts let you make custom 1-, 2- or 3-letter monograms in a groovy 60s style, with black or white backgrounds and a choice of decorative borders and other elements.

- 1. Install the fonts like any other. (Google: Install fonts in [my operating system].)
- 2. Relaunch the program you're working in. Now you're ready to make custom monograms with either font.

For 2-letter monograms (top 2 rows, below left)

- 3. Choose a border if desired, recommended with the Black font. Type it first (keystrokes in red).
- 4. Type a lowercase letter (a–z) for the left letter.
- 5. Type an uppercase letter (A–Z) for the right letter. That's it!



For 3-letter monograms (middle 2 rows left)

- 3. Choose a border if desired, recommended with the Black font. Type it first (keystrokes in red).
- 4. Type a lowercase letter (a–z) for the left letter.
- 5. Type an uppercase letter (A–Z) for the center letter.
- 6. Type a lowercase letter (a–z) for the right letter. That's it!



A bit more decoration (bottom 2 rows left)

With the White font, you can add decorative accents within the borders. With both fonts, you can add antennae to your butterfly. Type these *after* the border key, *before* the letter keys.

For 1-letter monograms (2 right columns at right)

- 3. Choose a border if desired, recommended with the Black font. Type it first (keystrokes in red).
- 4. Choose a symbol or blank (zero). Type it, keystrokes in red.
- 5. Type an uppercase letter (A–Z) for the center letter.
- 6. Choose a symbol or blank (zero). Type it, keystrokes in red. That's it!

For 2-letter monograms with center decorations (2 left columns at right)

- 3. Choose a border if desired, recommended with the Black font. Type it first (keystrokes in red).
- 4. Type a lowercase letter (a–z) for the left letter.
- 5. Choose a symbol or blank (right parenthesis). Type it, keystrokes in red.
- 6. Type a lowercase letter (a–z) for the right letter. That's it!
